

**A. INTRODUCTION**

Throughout this Amendment these entities are referred to as follows:

Native Village of Port Lions	=	Village
Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium	=	ANTHC
Cooperative Project Agreement	=	CPA
Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority	=	AMHTA
Indian Health Service	=	IHS
Denali Commission	=	Commission

On Feb. 24, 2005, ANTHC and the Native Village of Port Lions executed a CPA authorized by the Denali Commission to construct a new health clinic in Port Lions, Alaska. Project activities included site preparation, materials and equipment, construction, and labor.

The project was originally funded with \$828,057, via Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award Project No. 0146-DC-2004-I29, dated September 2004.

**B. REVISION OF PROJECT BUDGET**

This Amendment adds the following:

- \$500,000 of Commission funding, via Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award Project No. 185-05, dated August 2005
- \$251,524 of 2005 Indian Health Service Tribal Equipment funds
- \$50,000 of Alaska Mental Health Trust Authority funds

Project funding therefore totals \$1,629,581.



Based upon proposed Federal funding for this project, an environmental review in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) is required. The Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) has considered all potential environmental concerns (specific and cumulative effects) associated with the project in consultation with applicable federal, state, and local authorities. An environmental review was completed in January 2005 with respect to the proposed sanitation facilities construction at Port Lions, Alaska under Project No. AN 04-GB4. This Amendment will not change the scope outlined in the original document, and therefore no additional environmental review is necessary at this time.
